

Take part in the Postiljonen Auction from your home!



Postiljonen now offers the choice of Live Bidding for all clients. This means you can bid on items in real-time during the auction, from your home at your computer, just as if you were in the auction room.

In order to participate as a Live Bidder in the auction you must have an account for the Postiljonen web catalogue. If you have previously submitted written bids through the web catalogue you already have an account, otherwise you can create an account at www.postiljonen.com

In order to be approved to bid live during the auction, you must also register as a Live Bidder and be assigned a bidder number. This must be done before every auction.

Once you have registered you will receive an email confirming that your request have been sent, but it is only when you receive a second email from us, where we have assigned you a bidder number, that you are ready to start bidding live.

As usual, it will of course be possible to submit written bids, bid by telephone or use an agent.



Mail Bidders!

We always endeavour to simulate the actual auction situation for our mail bidders, you must however beforehand have determined the maximum you wish to pay for each lot and we will ensure that this maximum is not exceeded. Your bids must be in Euro and divisible by 10. The bidding always starts with the second highest mail bid plus the next increase (see conditions of sale sect. 2). The bidding then continues between the bidders in the audience and the highest mail bidder.

Avoid missing out on every item you wanted because of higher bids from others by bidding on many items but limit your total purchase to an amount of your choice (see bid form "my total purchase must not exceed:...excl. commission"). You can for example bid for a sum of $\leqslant 10\,000$ but limit your total purchase to $\leqslant 1\,000$ or any amount you wish.

You can also bid on two or several items and add "or" in between. We will then make sure that you get only one of these items.

Further, according to your instructions we can for example also raise your bid on one item if it turns out that you got another item less expensive than your highest bid.

Should there be two or more equal mail bids then the first bid received will buy the lot, so please submit your bids as early as possible.

To ensure you a safe handling of your bids, we need them *at least 24 hours* before the auction starts.



The Kaypmy Holdings

Dr. Kan Hou Sek Jim, aged 63, has over 30 years of experience in the construction industry in Hong Kong. He obtained a degree of Bachelor of Science from the Heriot-Watt University in 1981, majoring in civil engineering. Dr. Kan also obtained a degree of Master of Science in Engineering Geology from Imperial College of Science and Technology in 1983. In 1987, Dr. Kan was awarded the degree of Doctor of Philosophy by the Victoria University of Manchester.

In 1993, Dr. Kan started his own construction business and has since travelled extensively between Hong Kong, Tianjin, Shanghai, Auckland (NZ) and London. During his business trips, he liked to explore the history of each city and started to develop his philatelic interest in these countries.



Dr. Kan became a regular visitor to stamp auctions with various auctioneers. He built up a very extensive collection of China (including Ching Dynasty, ROC, Hung Hsien, Manchukuo, PRC, Hong Kong and Macao) and of New Zealand (including many unique items in the Victorian period).

With the growth of his business, Dr. Kan has had less and less time for managing his philatelic collection and so, he started to buy written up collections and rarities at auctions. Some were developed, however, many of his collections were stored in warehouses in London and Hong Kong intact without opening after auctions.

After his semi retirement in 2020, Dr. Kan examined his philatelic collections and found that he may not have sufficient resources to study all his collections. Recognizing that most of these collections are historical documents, Dr. Kan decided to return these documents to the public. It is his belief that these philatelic/historical documents should be well protected and passed on to future generations.

Extra scans on the web!

We often get requests for additional scans and sometimes in higher resolutions, sometimes for research or documentation purposes.



The Gate of Heavenly Peace

The Unissued Stamp

When this set was issued in June 1956, it was immediately discovered on the stamp picturing the Southern Gate of the Emperor's Palace, that the sunbeams came from a setting sun, while the intention was to show the gate in sunrise.

The sale was immediately stopped, however some copies had already been sold and are now great rarities. A new and "correct" stamp was produced, but not issued until February 1957. A copy of this is enclosed and shown below for comparison.







The Last Chinese Empire

Hung Hsien

The Last Chinese Empire: Hung Hsien

The postal history of the last Chinese Empire, Hung Hsien, are shown here together with the most striking express stamp strips with the characters "Hung Hsien" overprinted on the receipt portion.

Contrary to public belief, the last Chinese Empire was not the Ching Dynasty, and the last emperor of China was not Pu Yi. The last emperor of China was Yuan Shih-Kai (portrait on postcard). Yuan was a renegade Ching general who switched sides when he saw that the 1911 revolution would engulf the entire country. The leaders of the revolution needed Yuan as an ally because he controlled a vital portion of Ching military power. For his cooperation, Yuan demanded that he is named President of the new Republic of China, and this was done.

Yuan, however, had his own agenda. On December 11, 1915, only four years after the birth of the Republic, Yuan abolished the Republic, had his supporters vote him in as the new emperor and created a new constitutional monarchy. He called his reign **Hung Hsien** and he established his empire on New Year's Day, 1916.

Yuan's reign was short-lived. Because he lacked support from provincial leaders, he had to concede defeat. His reign ended on March 23, 1916, and he died on June 6.





The Empire prepared stamps (the set shown above was also overprinted "Restricted for use in Sinkiang Province"), and also overprinted regular Republic of China definitives. None of these, however, was ever formally issued.

One can identify the new Empire's usages only from the dates of postal markings - covers or used stamps with dates between January 1 and March 23, 1916. Although authorities in Peking decreed that all post offices must stop using "fifth year" in postal markings (i.e., the 5th year of the Republic of China) and use "first year" or "Yuan Nien" (first year of the new Empire) instead, some post offices ignored the directive. These "5th Year" markings are much scarcer than "first year" markings.

The Postal History of the Last Chinese Empire: Hung Hsein Usage in Period 1 (Dec. 11 to Dec 31, 1915)

The declaration for China to revert back to an Empire from a Republic was on December 11th, 1915. In reality, since the declaration, China was functioning as an Empire already. These are the "Cross-over covers". As these were sent while China was still a Republic, but by the time the covers arrived, China had become an empire again. 1915 was the Republic's fourth year, which is the year that was visible in the cancels.

From these examples, only those with Peking 5 (sub-office) were recorded with ovpt., as the example from Peking 2 showed no ovpt.

One would question why the central government would have no knowledge that the ovpt., as it was in use for over 2 months at an office right in the city. As such, it is highly likely that they had knowingly allowed the use of the ovpt.
